

MAG Economic Development Committee Composition (Updated September 2020)

Mission

The mission of the MAG Economic Development Committee (EDC) is to inform policy makers and business leaders on evolving regional economic issues, trends and best practices, and how the region can support these issues through collaboration.

Composition

1. **Twenty (21) MAG member agency elected officials - to be appointed by the MAG Regional Council.** The seven largest cities in addition to the City of Phoenix would have seats on the EDC and be included as part of the (21) MAG member agencies.
 - Central City
 - Maricopa County
 - One Pinal County Member Agency (Apache Junction, Florence, Maricopa or Pinal County)
 - One Native Nation
 - Eight West Valley
 - Eight East Valley
 - One Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) leadership representative. The ADOT leadership seat on EDC will be selected by the ADOT Director.

Terms - In accordance with the MAG Committee Operating Policies and Procedures, the MAG member agency elected official members will have one-year terms with possible reappointment by recommendation of the Executive Committee and approval of the MAG Regional Council. Appointments occur each June.

2. **Fifteen (15) business members of the MAG Economic Development Committee representing region-wide business interests.**

Terms - The business members will have two-year terms with possible reappointment by recommendation of the Executive Committee and approval of the MAG Regional Council. Appointments will occur in June.
